Wildly Important Goal #2: 97% Attendance

- <u>Campus Improvement Plan</u>- Helton provided an overview of the 2 campus goals- and what action items we would use to achieve these goals. Handouts provided for all participants.
- Parent Involvement Policy & Home School Compact Revisions Helton asked for participants to review these documents and then share out any suggestions for improvement or questions they had regarding them. We previously discussed sharing information through video for parents that might not be able to read. Suggestions that these could be done as videos for upcoming family engagement events. Questions about parent surveys- decreasing the number of questions. 10 questions and only 1 comment box. Student led conferences should be student led by teachers- have new teachers familiar with this process, understanding that they are to help the student talk about their

own data. Helton would like to be specific on the home school compact regarding reading with their students and working on math facts.

- Parent Input on Title 1 Training-parents and staff- Tre Baldwin discussed the information that we have designed for sharing with parents and staff regarding Title 1 and what it means for our school.
- Specials Newsletter- The art, pe, and musics teacher will be creating a newsletter that will be sent home monthly. Suggestion to send the newsletter electronically, as well as a rotating schedule to parents so they know when their child has PE, dates of upcoming events, please send it on Wednesdays with the other communication, please include lots of videos and pictures so that parents can see what students are doing. Might include question stems for parents to ask their students questions and talk with their children.

 - Thanksgiving Lunch: Thursday, November 16
- Attendance & Discipline Data
 - Anchor Club (Voyager club) a school wide behavior incentive plan. August to December- students allowed to do a fun activity and then January to May second reward for students with no referrals. Video to go out on Monday.
 - Attendance- 98%, 96%, 95% we are checking on them to call and checking on students who are missing several days of school. Staff calling to see where students are when they are sick.
 - o Discipline- 3 ISS incidents, lots of progress with behavior for little friends. (Pre-K, etc.)
